Ye White Hart, the historic Barnes riverside pub at the top of White Hart Lane.....just a few yards from here Sainsbury's want to open a 'Local' store...

"It's an absolute disgrace to go ahead with this plan for White Hart Lane. I don't know a single local person who wants this scheme. Not ONE"

"I am frankly appalled that the opinions of local people are being so wilfully ignored on this matter"

These are just a few of the hundreds of comments on our website, rejecting this unwanted, unnecessary and unwelcome development.


Despite unprecedented public opposition to the scheme and despite refusal of planning consent by Richmond Council, the developers, Oakmill Properties Ltd, won an appeal to the Planning Inspectorate in November 2006.

In March of this year, we finally discovered that it was Sainsbury's who planned to open a supermarket on this site. In a recent comment, attributed to Justin King, CEO of Sainsbury's, it was claimed that the planned store will "regenerate the area"! If, like us, you actually know and love Barnes, then see overleaf to find out how you can help to protect this special corner of south west London for now and for future generations.

Enjoy Barnes Fair! - and remember that the Barnes Community Association was originally formed to fight off unwanted and inappropriate development.



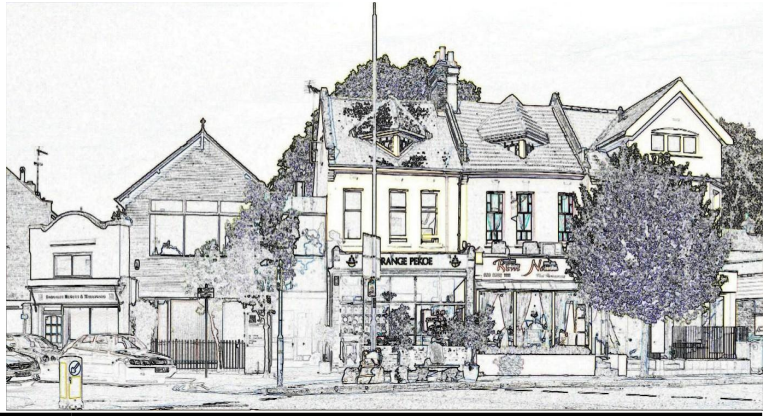
